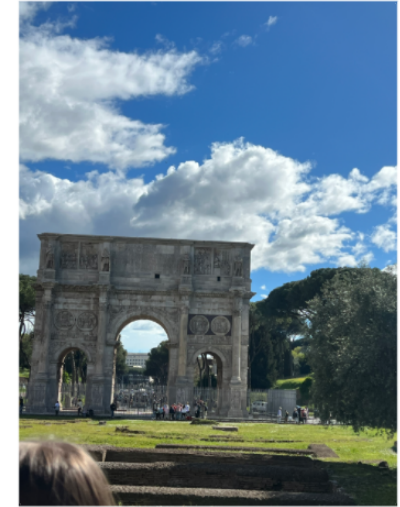
The Colosseum is one of Rome's most famous landmarks and one of the most significant architectural achievements of the ancient world.

**The Vatican is the spiritual and administrative center of the Roman Catholic Church, and it is home to many beautiful works of art and architecture.**

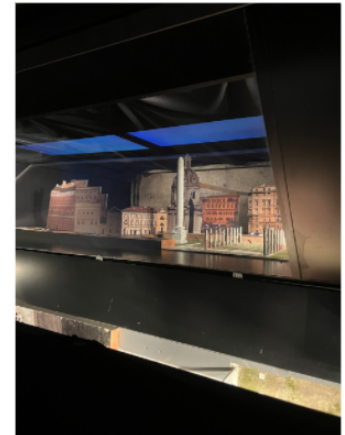

**Emperor Hadrian and his family, but it was later used as a fortress and castle. Today, it is a museum that showcases the history of the building and the city of Rome.**

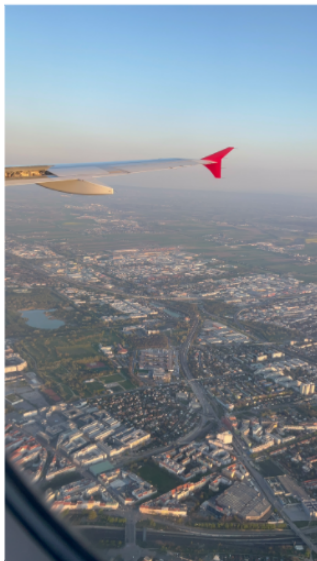
