### **Survey Insight – Saying Goodbye**



#### Disclaimer:



In the daily reflection survey, students were asked whether they were sad about the exchange coming to an end. The results show a **mixed picture**:

- 67% (4 out of 6 students) answered yes, I am sad.
- 33% (2 out of 6 students) answered no, I'm not sad.

This reflects both the strong friendships formed during the week and the bittersweet feeling of having to leave after such an intense experience.
